The Faculty Senate conducts its business through a system of five councils (Academic Affairs, Faculty Development and Administrative Relations, Faculty Governance, Judiciary and Appeals, and Resource Policies and Allocations) and their committees. The Executive Board of the Faculty Senate consists of the chairs of the five councils, the chairs of the seven college caucuses, and the officers. The Faculty Senate was established in 1988.











Enrollment: Gender by College and Level








Student Enrollment by Iowa County: Fall 2022 UGrad Students in All Colleges






Student Enrollment by Iowa County: Fall 2022 Grad Students in All Colleges






Student Enrollment by State: Fall 2022 UGrad Students in All Colleges






Student Enrollment by State: Fall 2022 Grad Students in All Colleges





Student Enrollment by State: Fall 2022 Prof Students in The College of Veterinary Medicine







































Average Tenure-Track Faculty Salaries by Rank











Student Credit Hours (SCH) by College and Course Level





Fall Semesters




Spring Semesters











ISU Active Patents, 2014-2023




