





Fall 2023 Semester Headcount and Percent Female








Student Enrollment by Iowa County: Fall 2023 UGrad Students in All Colleges






Student Enrollment by Iowa County: Fall 2023 Grad Students in All Colleges






Student Enrollment by State: Fall 2023 UGrad Students in All Colleges






Student Enrollment by State: Fall 2023 Grad Students in All Colleges





Student Enrollment by State: Fall 2023 Prof Students in The College of Veterinary Medicine



































Average Tenure-Track Faculty Salaries by Rank





Fall Semesters









Donor Designation for Gifts 2022-2023







ISU Active Patents, 2014-2023




